The last plague will be a devastating blow to every Egyptian household, while the people of Israel will escape. This will finally bring the people out of their slavery. Before the event actually happens, though, God prepares the people for a feast which will be celebrated for generations to come just to remind the people of God's wonderful power in the deliverance of his people.

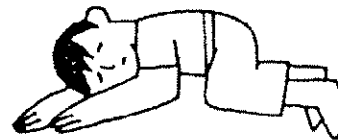

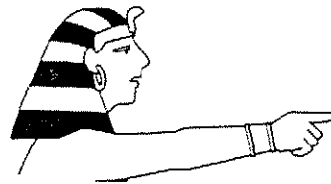

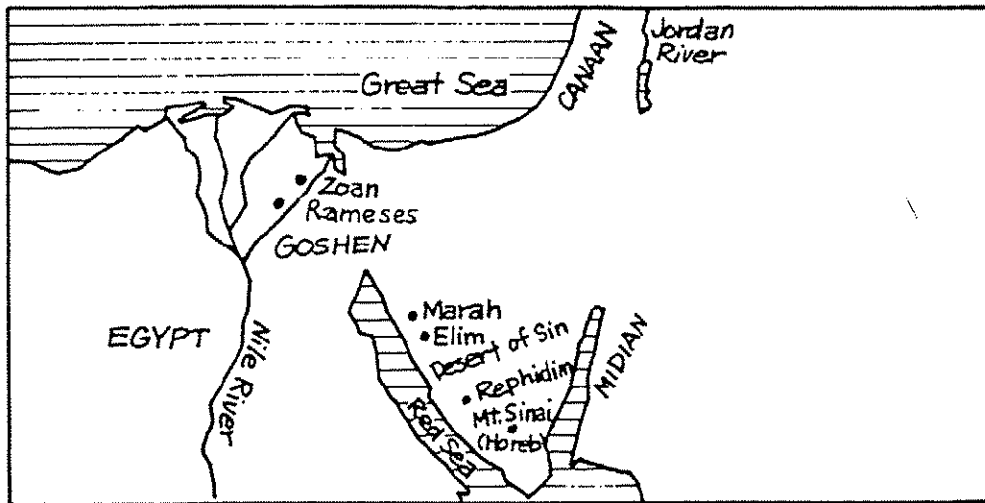
