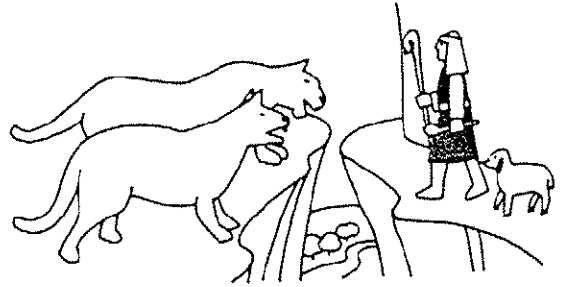
David and The Psalms

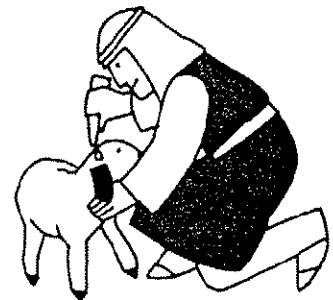

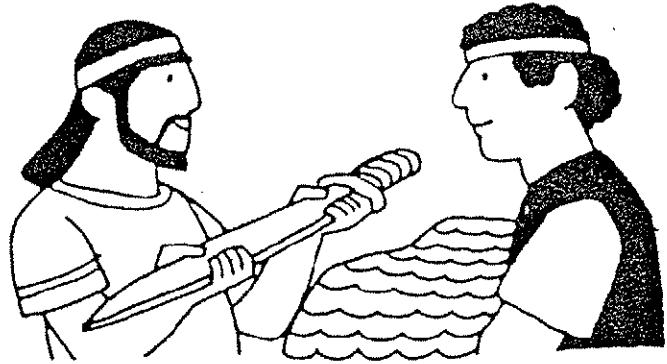
